Subject: Important Update in Trash and Recycle Collection

Hafa adai GSWA Customer,

Effective Monday, January 29, 2024, GSWA will be implementing the use of its new Automated / Side Loading Refuse Trucks in Paradise Estates and Paradise Meadows.

To enhance efficiency, GSWA has introduced automated/side loading refuse trucks to its fleet. These innovative vehicles are designed to streamline the waste collection process.

To ensure the optimal functioning of GSWA's automated/side loading refuse trucks and maintain a smooth waste collection process, we kindly request your cooperation in adhering to the following guidelines for proper cart placement:

**Placement of Carts:** Trash and recycle carts should be placed curbside the night before your collection day, no more than four feet away from the road.

**Orientation:** Position the cart with the short metal bar facing the street.

**Spacing:** Ensure a minimum of three feet of space between carts and other obstacles, such as parked cars, mailboxes, or utility poles.

**Clear Access:** Ensure that there are no obstacles obstructing access to the cart, such as parked vehicles, overhanging tree branches, or other objects.

**Bagging and Tying of Trash:** All trash placed inside the bin must be securely bagged and tied to prevent scattering during the collection process. Properly bagging your trash helps maintain a clean and safe environment.

We believe that these changes will contribute to a more streamlined waste collection process.
